





Lynda Murray, acclaimed Los Angeles interior designer, in collaboration with Fairmont Miramar Hotel & Bungalows, has introduced the first eight suites in a series of renovations that offer guests a distinct residential atmosphere inspired by Santa Monica culture and lifestyle. Lynda's style fuses classic with contemporary and the new 785 sq. ft. one-bedroom suites embody the eclectic and casual elegance of Southern California.







Design Detailing



Each suite offers inviting views of the Pacific ocean and the carefully selected, locally-sourced accents chosen by Lynda contribute to the overall aesthetic of each room and capture sense of place.

The Roada Lamp Tables by Arte Fina are composed of reclaimed elm wood to reflect the rugged coastline. Situated on the table's surface is a Glass Step Beaker Lab Lamp with an adjustable arm in polished chrome for a modern touch.











The couches are decorated with hand-crafted Fleet
Semaphore cushions by Timothy Oulton with materials used from recycled sailing flags.

Lynda deliberately selected the "F" and "M" to represent Fairmont Miramar.

The coffee table in the center of the living room incorporates steel and reclaimed driftwood from local beaches.



Local Detail Design

Floral sculptures created by LA-based Little World Design create splashes of color throughout the suite. The pictured Japanese Dream Tree uses carefully preserved orange moss from local beaches, sculpted to a natural Manzanita branch from driftwood, that is secured in a ceramic bowl with white sand. The sculptures vary in each room, and all materials are gathered locally.






The suites' hardwood floors boast Old Masters Flooring's Garrison Collection in hickory. Each plank is individually hand distressed using different tools and techniques, and then beautifully stained and fine finished.



Iconic meets Modern



Henry Diltz photography that is symbolic of Los Angeles and Santa Monica uniquely decorate the suites' walls, including what is considered to be his most famous black and white 1969 photograph of The Doors walking Venice Beach. The band immortalized their love of Los Angeles in their song "LA Woman."

Lynda selected each piece personally with Henry for and each suite has a signature photograph, such as Neil Young in Malibu. Every photograph are also signed by its artist, Henry Diltz.

Each suite offers a marble wet bar, equipped with classic 1920's-inspired cocktail recipes and a retro espresso coffee maker.
